Snyder County Children and Youth Services is preparing for their Ninth Annual “Back to School Fair” with a goal of providing backpacks filled with school supplies to local children in need. During the “fair” families who pre-register will receive age appropriate school supplies as well as information about services the SCC&Y provides. We can help this worthy mission in two ways: donation of items, or donation of money. MISSION TRIPS

Interested in doing some mission work? There are a number of Volunteers in Mission (VIM) trips being organized by churches and VIM teams around the conference, all of whom would be overjoyed at having you join in. These trips include working in different areas within the conference (Lewistown, Williamsport, Lycoming County), regional trips (West Virginia, and North Carolina), and global trips (Mexico, Belize, Costa Rica). Costs range from \$30.00 to \$2600.00. Thanks to the last several Blueberry Festivals, there is money available for VIM scholarships (talk to PB or Pam Perna). Interested? Stop by the Mission & Ministry table in Fellowship Hall to pick up a full list of trips. In addition to that list, the Young People’s Ministry Council (YPMC) is working with the conference VIM coordinator to plan two trips in 2018. One is scheduled for March 3-11 for young adults (ages 18-25) and will be going to Costa Rica; the cost should be around \$1700.00. The other trip is for youth and is scheduled to go the Henderson Settlement in Franks, KY from June 24-30; cost is estimated at \$400.00 with openings for 20 youth (14-18) and seven adults.

GEC PROGRAM

The Growing Effective Churches (GEC) pilot program of which we are a part is underway. The clergy group has met a number of times for book study and relationship building. The laity group will be meeting this afternoon for their first study and conversation session. This will be continuing throughout the year with the laity discussing three books and the clergy working through about ten. In the fall/winter, each of the churches involved will be going through a consultation process which will help them celebrate their successful ministries and processes and giving suggestions on changing and "tweaking" others in order for each to be truly effective for the ministry and kingdom of God. Our church's consultation is scheduled for September 29th through October 1st. Throughout the coming months, please wrap the laity and clergy of our church, each of our partner churches, and the entire process with prayer seeking God's wisdom, guidance, and courage.
